Introduction and respondents

The European Strategic Cluster Partnerships – Going International (ESCPs-4i) were labelled by the European Commission, DG Growth and the Executive Agency for SMEs of the European Commission following the COSME call COS-CLUSTER-2014-3-03 – Cluster Go International. Their activities started as ESCP-4i labelled partnerships at the beginning of 2016.

The ESCP-4i are transnational cluster partnerships that develop and implement a joint internationalisation strategy and support SME internationalisation towards third countries beyond Europe. They aim to develop common actions and an implementation roadmap as part of a long-term cooperation agenda. The projects labelled in 2016 were at different stages of their development.

At the request of the European Commission and EASME, the European Cluster Collaboration Platform (ECCP) invited the European Strategic Cluster Partnerships – Going International to a survey related to their activities and the interactions with the ECCP. The main aim of this survey was to enable the ECCP to put in place services and activities to support the ESCP-4i projects to fulfil their objectives.

The survey was shared with the 24 ESCP-4i projects' coordinators¹. **19 projects** responded to the questionnaire. Survey and invitations were launched on 10 June and the survey initially open until 22 June, then prolonged until 23 June 2016.

An analysis of the results to the survey was made and shared with the Executive Agency for SMEs and DG Growth of the European Commission. The present document provides an overview of the analysis, aimed for public consultation.

I. ESCP-4i profiles on the ECCP

From the survey it appears that **all ESCP-4i project coordinators consider their project profile on ECCP as kept up-to-date**, but only 10 (53%) ESCP-4i have published a news item on the platform. Efforts will be intensified to encourage ESCP-4i projects to regularly publish news items on the ECCP.

II. ESCP-4i: targets, activities

A. Target Countries and challenges

The United States of America was chosen as a target for international cooperation by the majority (47.37%) of the ESCP-4i. Amongst other countries that are ranked highly as a target for international cooperation are Brazil, Canada, China, Japan and Mexico which all have 5 or more ESCP-4i having identified these countries as a target. The countries that were not selected by any ESCP-4i are not found in the diagram below.

The survey also gave them the choice to select a region. As shown in the diagram below the region that most ESCP-4i would like to cooperate with internationally is Latin America with North America closely behind.

The main difficulties mentioned by the ESCP-4i coordinators in accessing third markets were:

- the difficulty to identify counterparts (clusters) and other business networks in third countries;
- the lack of market knowledge;
- or the characteristics of the market itself that could hinder the ability of SMEs to reach the market e.g. "the Brazilian market is very protective so for small companies it might be difficult to enter the market and develop proper collaborations"; as well as the difficulty to find companies in the countries that would be interested in and are interesting for cooperation with European SMEs;
- and sectoral concerns were also mentioned such as the different levels of development of one sector from a country to another, or the necessity to first analyse the project value chain before going international.

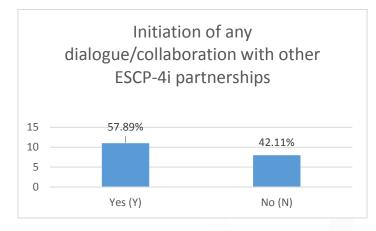




III. Collaboration activities between ESCP-4i projects and the role of the ECCP

Collaboration activities between ESCP-4i projects

Out of the 19 projects, 11 (58%) indicated that they have initiated a collaboration with another ESCP-4i partnership, at least.



Some projects have indicated a cooperation with 2 or more other projects, e.g.:

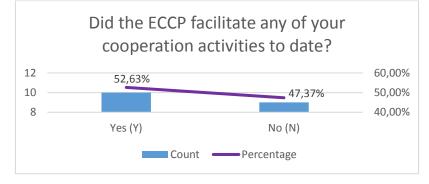

The ECCP as facilitator and support for the ESCP-4i success

Amongst the 19 projects, 10 indicated that the ECCP had supported them for their cooperation activities.



Amongst the 10 projects which indicated that the ECCP had supported their cooperation activities, the help provided by the ECCP was described as follows:

- Support provided at the ESCP-4i launch event (March 2016): for example, international target countries workshops were animated by the ECCP team there.
- Information provided: information about the events, trade missions and activities organised by the EC, other clusters and ESCP-4i, notably international opportunities; information on relevant calls for clusters and SMEs; information on EC policies directed to internationalisation...
- Cluster matchmaking events: the ECCP organises matchmaking missions in Europe and international missions beyond Europe. The ECCP organised the EU-US cluster matchmaking mission in the frame of the Hannover Messe 2016 for example, which was perceived as a really useful event by several ESCP-4i projects.
- Promotion: the ECCP newsletters give visibility to the ESCP-4i activities as well as the activities of the cluster organisations.
- **Facilitation of collaboration:** *it allows the ESCP-4i to follow the activities of the other partnerships for example.*

This report has presented the results of the first survey amongst the ESCP-4i projects. Follow-up surveys are planned within the upcoming year for which the analysis report shall equally be published on the ECCP.
