

Cluster policies & programmes across Europe – State of Play 2023

Almost 50 relevant policies in the EU27 identified in 2023:

17 national cluster policies

8 regional cluster policies


19 broad & 3 sectoral policies



Thirteen Member States employ a dedicated **national and/or regional** cluster policy




National and/or regional cluster policies often found in **central & southern EU MS**, whereas sectoral/broad policies are more frequent in eastern/Baltic MS.

Role of clusters in Cohesion Policy programmes 2021-2027 – three examples



Netherlands

North Netherlands: Includes an intervention on support for innovation clusters mainly for the benefit of SMEs. Budget: ~20 Mio. EUR

South Netherlands: Includes an intervention on support for innovation clusters, mainly for the benefit of SMEs. Budget: ~9.2 Mio. EUR

East Netherlands: Support for specific cluster activities as part of innovation / valorisation projects. Economic sustainability (viability of the business case) as a selection criterion for projects.



Croatia

The Integrated Territorial Programme
OP supports cluster development with
10 Mio. EUR as part of its regional
development strategy through
Regional Industrial Transition Plans.

Support is organised in **two streams**:

- Investment grants to build or upgrade cluster organisations
- Operational grants for training and internationalisation support for cluster members



Portugal

Six out of seven Portuguese regional OPs support clusters.

Support is linked closely with the **smart specialization** areas, innovation and internationalization of SMEs.

The **national OP** COMPETE 2030 is directly linked to the **Competitiveness Clusters programme** and builds on the **RIS3 paradigm**.

Clusters are supported under PO1 for **R&I and SME competitiveness** and PO2 for **decarbonisation** and the **energy** transition.

How cluster policies can support the implementation of **European Semester** recommendations:



Green Transition: Building circular industrial ecosystems; energy and resource efficiency along supply chains; green innovation



Digital transition: Facilitate digital adoption in SMEs; creating digital innovation ecosystems; cross-sectoral Industry 4.0 development



Resilience building: Supply chain resilience and diversification; local reindustrialisation; resilient energy planning



Skill development: Intermediaries between firms and training institutions; co-organising training programmes; attracting talent



Innovation system: Promote joint R&D projects; enhance R&D investment; knowledge and technology transfer, venture clienting

Integrating cluster support with **Smart Specialisation** within **Cohesion Policy** OPs



Pôles de compétitivité

- Established and dedicated cluster policy (since 2005)
- Phase IV (2019-2022) focused on European cluster cooperation and alignment with regional development strategies
- Phase V (since 2023) adds a focus on grand challenges of the twin transition and economic sovereignty

Cooperation Clusters & Technological Platforms

- Coordination Clusters as established and long-running OP funding stream for SMEs and research institutions
- Technological Platforms as sectoral cooperation platforms supporting the twin transition, advanced technologies, European collaboration





Outlook: Some initial observations

1) Cluster support today is delivered through different types of policies & programmes

- ➤ While **dedicated cluster policies** are present in a majority of countries, others run their cluster support through **broader** programmes.
- A key question is: how do you finance cluster policy and how do different funding mechanisms (e.g. ERDF) relate to each other.



2) Cluster policy and Smart Specialisation

- > Sometimes cluster support is directly enacted through RIS3-guided programmes, sometimes clusters are only involved in RIS3 processes.
- Smart Specialisation Strategies can serve to build strategic links between cluster policy and regional development strategy.



3) Cluster policy as institution-building for critical transitions


- > Supporting cluster development is no longer just an issue of innovation and competitiveness but relates to a range of **grand challenges**.
- Cluster organisations provide an increasingly important institutional infrastructure to implement the green and digital transitions for whole sectors and industrial ecosystems



FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES





Experimentation and exchange of good practices for value creation

- Europe needs to **translate available scientific knowledge and research results to innovative solutions**, including technological as well as non-technological and social innovations, in the market, in society and for better policy making. We need more experimentation, peer learning and testing of new models as well as trying out good practices in different environments.
- Projects results are expected to contribute to the following objectives:
 - Value creation and transfer to the economy and society by increased interlinkages and cooperation between knowledge valorisation actors (academia/research; industry/SMEs; public administration/policy-makers and society/citizens)
 - **New solutions** to societal and economic challenges by stronger uptake and deployment of research results, including through the involvement of citizens and civil society
 - **Improvements** of structures, strategies, practices and skills for knowledge valorisation through sustainable reforms and new initiatives

Alliances for Education and Enterprises

- Alliances for Education and Enterprises are transnational, structured and result-driven projects, in which partners share common goals and work together to **foster innovation**, **new skills**, **a sense of initiative and entrepreneurial mind-sets**.
- They aim to foster innovation in higher education, vocational education and training, enterprises and the broader socio-economic environment. They bring together **enterprises and both higher education and vocational training providers** to work together in partnership.
- These partnerships shall implement a coherent and comprehensive set of sectoral or cross-sectoral activities, which should be adaptable to **future knowledge developments** across the EU.
- To boost innovation, the focus will be on talent and skills development.
- Deadline: 7 March 2024

13 Capacity Building, Strand 2b

- The Interregional Innovation Investments Instrument (I3) creates **linkages for interregional collaboration** bringing together actors from different EU regions investing in joint innovation projects along S3 priorities and close to the market.
- The call aims to test new approaches for increasing the capacity of regional innovation ecosystems in **less developed regions** to collaborate in EU value chains.
- Projects are expected to deliver a pipeline of potential interregional investments as well as business and investment plans.
- Deadline: 14 November 2024

Opportunities for SMEs: Calls from Euroclusters

- <u>Elbe Eurocluster:</u> Financial support to **individual services**, including access to test facilities, international development, market & business intelligence, Development and technology transfer, Green and IT technology expertise; deadline 8 March 2024
- <u>FRIEND CCI</u>: Call for **providers** offering solutions in **digitalisation**, **greening**, **and internationalisation** to collaborate with **Creative and Cultural** SMEs for the realization of funded projects; deadline 1 August 2025
- GEMSTONE: Financial support for training related to Green Manufacturing; deadline 31 December 2024
- <u>INGENIOUS</u>: **Internationalisation** grant for SMEs operating in **energy-intensive industries** to develop activities related to Africa, Asia, North America and Latin America; deadline 30 September 2024

- <u>RESIST:</u> **Networking and marketing** FSTP for SMEs from the **Automotive Mobility Transport** ecosystem; deadline 20 December 2024
