OBJECTIVES

The European Commission (EC) will organise the EU – Taiwan Matchmaking Event in the context of the global ICT and IoT show and exhibition <u>Computex 2023</u> which will be held on 30 May – 1 June 2023.

The **EU – Taiwan Matchmaking Event** itself will take place on-site in Taipei, Taiwan on 30 May – 1 June 2023.

The event will be jointly organised by the European Commission through the European Cluster Collaboration Platform (ECCP), in collaboration with the Chinese National Federation of Industries (CNFI), the Taiwan External Trade Development Council (TAITRA), the Bureau of Foreign Trade (BoFT) – Ministry of Economic Affairs (MoEA).

The **EU – Taiwan Matchmaking Event** will bring together cluster organisations and SMEs from the European Union (EU), non-EU COSME countries, and Taiwan. It will provide participants an excellent chance to promote Cluster to Cluster (C2C), Cluster to Business (C2B), and Business to Business (B2B) collaborations. The event will be held on-site at the Taipei Nangang Exhibition Centre, as a side event of the global ICT and IoT show and exhibition <u>Computex 2023</u>.

The overall objective of the event is to promote information exchange and networking opportunities for European cluster organisations and their members with counterparts from Taiwan, particularly in the fields of ICT, Semiconductors and Digital industries, Robotics, AI, Advanced manufacturing, Circular Economy, Renewable Energy, Sustainability, Smart city, Connectivity and 6G.

The objectives for the participants include:

• Strengthening EU-Taiwan cluster cooperation for the benefit of their members, including through a seminar, a cluster matchmaking event, and visits;

• Identifying potential areas of common interest for cooperation and synergies, in terms of the sectoral, value chain, and market focus of their SMEs and other companies;

• Through clusters, improving EU-Taiwan industry and academia-industry collaboration in research, development, and innovation. For its members, the clusters will identify possible areas of RDI collaboration (academia, research organisations, industries...).

This call for expressions of interest is being launched to identify an European delegation made up of representatives from cluster organisations from various industry sectors (<u>please see section "Who can participate</u>" below) who are willing and committed to participate in an EU-Taiwan Matchmaking Event in the context of the global ICT and IoT show and exhibition <u>Computer 2023</u>

Cluster organisations and business network organisations that apply to this call must be willing and committed to engage in the EU-Taiwan Matchmaking Event's activities. By submitting an expression of interest in response to this call, you are indicating your acceptance of the call's terms.

Further details about the event, the eligibility requirements, and how to submit an expression of interest can be found below. Clusters that apply will be notified of the selection results with the shortest possible delay. Participants who are selected will receive an official confirmation and additional information.

CONTEXT OF THE INITIATIVE

The Event will take place in the context of the ECCP activities. The European Commission facilitates international cluster cooperation through the ECCP including the organisation of specific cluster matchmaking events and policy development actions. The objective is to support cluster organisations to develop partnerships and business cooperation in European and global markets, for the benefit of their members, especially of SMEs. The events are currently funded under the EU Competitiveness of Enterprises and SMEs Programme (COSME). As the cornerstone of the European strategy in support of SMEs' internationalisation through clusters, the ECCP provides a wide range of information and services to facilitate the interaction between clusters not only within Europe, but also with international partners.



ACTIVITIES & AGENDA

The EU – Taiwan Matchmaking Event will include the following activities:

- **Preparatory Webinar** an opportunity to receive information on doing business in Taiwan and guidance on how to participate successfully in the planned event. *(date tbc)*
- **Technical Webinar** a session helping future participants of the matchmaking event to make the most of their profiling in B2Match and explain the procedures to optimise the booking of meetings. *(date tbc)*
- Site visits (30 May 1 June)
- **Seminar** on knowledge exchange to foster EU-Taiwan cooperation. (30 May)
- **Matchmaking meetings** between cluster organisations and SMEs from EU (and non-EU COSME) countries and Taiwan. (31 May)
- Debriefing session to collect feedback and testimonials from cluster participants
- Participation at the global ICT and IoT show and exhibition <u>Computex 2023</u> 30 May 01June 2023 free of charge

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

This invitation is addressed to cluster and business network organisations interested in collaborating with Taiwan counterparts in the following areas:

- ICT/Semiconductors and Digital industries,
- Robotic/AI/Advanced manufacturing
- Circular Economy/Renewable energy/Sustainability
- Smart city/Connectivity/6G

Clusters with other thematic focuses could be also consider based on interest of Taiwanese participants.

The event will support funded participation of up to 20 representatives. More participants can be accepted upon confirmation and at their own cost. Late applications could be accepted for participation, provided that the eligibility criteria are fulfilled and that costs are borne by the participants. Late applications are accepted until 26 April 2023, 18:00 Brussels time at the latest.

PARTICIPATION CRITERIA

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible:

The cluster or business network organisation must be registered in the **European Cluster Collaboration Platform** (ECCP) (<u>www.clustercollaboration.eu</u>) (or have requested to be registered until one week prior to the Call for EOI') **with a complete profile** (a link to the complete cluster profile of each applicant (registered) on the ECCP should be provided through the application:

- The cluster or business network organisation must be engaged in providing or channelling cluster or network support services to SMEs and certify that it meets the description of 'innovation clusters' in Annex I of the "EU Framework for State Aid for Research, Development, and Innovation"; and
- The cluster or business network organisation must be a legal entity established in a European Union Member State or other COSME country. See the list of non-EU participants in the COSME programme here: <u>https://ec.europa.eu/docsroom/documents/39579</u>

SELECTION CRITERIA

Applications will be evaluated qualitatively using the following selection criteria:

- Cluster activity in the target sectors;
- The potential to maximise matchmaking and collaboration prospects via participation in this mission, as shown by a detailed explanation of the sort of partnership sought by the applicant and the likelihood of developing practical cooperation as a result of the event. This declaration of interest in cooperating must be concisely stated in the questions in the application form.
- The desire and capacity to collaborate more closely with other Taiwanese cluster and network organisations in order to better support SMEs, larger firms, and research actors in global competitiveness via collaborative efforts, as well as to assist them in initiating new projects.
- Clusters operating beyond the stated fields should extensively motivate the argument for their application to a reserve list that will be determined in due time.

Organisations that have not participated before in the ECCP matchmaking events are encouraged to apply. The selection of applications will be based on the afore mentioned criteria and information provided in the application form; in cases of equal merit, the balanced geographical and sector coverage of the EU and COSME participating countries will be considered. Furthermore, in cases of equal merit, organisations participating for the first time at the ECCP matchmaking event will have priority.

The organisers reserve the right to ask for additional information from the applicants, if necessary.

<u>Attendance at the seminar, the matchmaking event, the debriefing session, and the site visits</u> <u>are all compulsory.</u>

Cluster and Business Network Organisations selected to participate in the Event must send a commitment e-mail agreeing to attend the preparation webinar, the on-site seminar, conduct at least four meetings, attend the on-site visits and engage in the final 30-minute debriefing session.



COSTS AND REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES

- Return flight to Taiwan (without local transport), will be compensated based on actual costs but up to the limit of 950€/participant and up to the cost of the economy fare for the selected EU participants. Any upgrade on the fare will be at the cost of the participant.
- Maximum of 3 nights will be funded as 100% of the actual costs but up to the limit of 125€/night for the selected EU participants.

Note that if more than one person from the same organisation participates and requests reimbursement of expenses, only one person per organisation can be reimbursed.

The organising team will take every care to inform duly selected participants on agreed discounted rates for accommodation, as well as available airline offers.

Essential requirements to qualify for reimbursement of expenses:

- Attendance throughout the whole of the two-day agenda (30 May 1 June)
- Completing at least four meetings
- Attending local on-site visits
- Submitting a debriefing questionnaire at the event's debriefing session and a follow-up questionnaire provided as an online survey to assess follow-up activities four months following the event, with all areas filled in a sufficient amount of detail.

Covid-19: It is the responsibility of the participants to follow the latest entry regulations to Taiwan. Uncompleted travels due to Covid-19 will not be compensated.
